Physiotherapy - A dynamic profession!

Physiotherapy, The Profession with Pride.....!

SINCE AGES FOR AGES serving mankind as drugless healers of pain, dysfunction and thereby improving quality of life.

“PHYSIOTHERAPY means Physiotherapeutic system of medicine which includes examination, treatment, advice and instruction to any person preparatory to of or the purpose of or in connection with movement dysfunction, bodily malfunction, physical disorder, disability, healing and pain from trauma and diseases, physical and mental conditions using physical agents including exercises, mobilization, manipulation, mechanical and electro therapy, activities and devices for diagnosis, treatment and prevention.” - Definition by the Indian Association of Physiotherapists(IAP).

What is Physiotherapy?

Physiotherapy is a patient-centred profession which aims at optimising quality of life. This includes promotion of a healthy life style, prevention of illness and injury for those at risk and rehabilitation following injury or impairment of function (disability). Physiotherapists are trained to assess patient and to use skilled manual techniques, exercise therapy and electrotherapy to reduce pain, promote healing and improve function. The holistic approach to management includes counselling which empowers the patient and caregiver to improve their quality of life. Service is offered to patients of all ages with conditions such as bronchitis, asthma, cerebral palsy, strokes, fractured bones, stiff joints, sports injuries and painful peripheral joints, necks and backs etc.

Physiotherapy as a career

Modern world with sedentary, mechanical life has realized that the ability to move is invaluable. Mobility is life, life is mobility, so there by physiotherapy has become as essential part of all health care services offered by faculty of modern medicine.

patient/client homes, community centres, and hospitals; which includes outpatient clinics, wards and intensive care units. The Physiotherapy profession has primary contact status, which means that medical referral of clients is no longer required by law. This makes it possible to work and develop services in rural and urban settings, industry and as private practitioners.

There are career opportunities within areas of special interest, for example special schools, geriatric centres, industry and sports centres. Now there are over 3.5 lakh registered physiotherapist globally. In India, the number is 75000 & growing.

The Physiotherapy Profession

Physiotherapy profession started as bud with certificate course burgeoned into huge tree now offering bachelors, masters, doctorals and post doctoral fellowship programs in various specializations like orthopaedics, neurology, sports, geriatrics and cardio vascular conditions, paediatrics, community based rehabilitation etc.

Physiotherapists perform tests to assess patients; joint motion (goniometry), strength and endurance of muscles (dynamometry), joint stability (arthrokinematics), walking (gait) pattern, functional ability (physical work capacity); function of the heart and lungs (cardiorespiratory fitness), integrity of sensation and perception (sensorimotor status), need and use of braces (orthosis and prosthesis), and performance of activities required in daily living.

The treatment commonly administered by Physiotherapists include the use of therapeutic exercise (to increase strength, endurance, co-ordination and range of joint motion), heat (infra-red radiation, short-wave and microwave diathermies), ultra-violet radiation, ice (cryotherapy), electricity (transcutaneous electrical stimulation), sound (ultrasound), water (hydrotherapy), direct current to introduce medicinal ions into the skin and mucous membranes (iontophoresis), manual therapy, electro-acupuncture and cold laser.

Physiotherapists also provide educational services to prevent the incidence of physical disability and movement dysfunction. During treatment, the Physiotherapist monitors the patient’s performance and modifies the treatment plan in the light of patient’s responses and goals.

Apart from these services, Physiotherapists engage in research to develop more effective treatment or methods of evaluation in order to improve patient care. Cognitive scientific knowledge is the flesh of physiotherapy; while psychomotor skills and affective traits constitutes the soul of physiotherapy profession. Researchers from several parts of the world including India are contributing immensely to our body of knowledge.

UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE :

Genesis

The year 1896 marks the beginning of a new era in the history of women's education in India when Dr. Dhondo Keshav Karve established an ashram for widows and helpless women at Hingne, near Pune. He realized that to make these women self-sufficient, self-reliant and self-confident, schooling was essential at the ashram. Karve launched a programme of schooling at the ashram, which latter became regular school for girls and women. In a society governed by age old customs and conservative attitudes towards women, an institution of this type was bound to face social and economic difficulties. He had a dream of establishing women's university and his friends sent him a booklet on the Japanese women's university at Tokyo. In December 1915 Karve in his presidential address to the National Social Reform Congress at Bombay announced his decision to shape his dream into reality. And in 1916 the first college started with the enrollment of five students which gradually took shape as women's university. Karve did not wait for the Government permission for funds.....

The vision of Maharshi Karve and the foresight of Sir Vithaldas Thackersey led to the establishment of the first Women's University in India. Recognizing the pioneering work of Dr.Karve, Sir Vithaldas Thackersey made a generous contribution of Rs. 15 Lacs to commemorate the memory of his mother, Nathibai. In 1920 after the great benefactor's mother Nathibai, the University was named as Shreemati Nathibai Damodar Thackersey Women's University (S.N.D.T.).

In 1936, the head quarters of the University was shifted to Bombay. The University continued to grow, providing higher education to more and more women. In 1951, the University was granted statutory recognition and was renamed as Shreemati Nathibai Thackersey Women's University, now popularly known as SNDT Women's University. The recognition came along with the rare privilege of having a jurisdiction across the country.

Six year back, the SNDT University has celebrated Centenarial year. SNDT has become a symbol of excellence in higher educational opportunities for women. The journey has been a long one since 1916. There are three university campuses-two at Mumbai-Churchgate and Juhu and one at Karve Road, Pune.

Vision

The vision of Bharat Ratna Dr. D.K. Karve to build a citadel of learning for women is encapsulated in the motto of the University- 'Sanskrita Stree Parashakti' (An enlightened women is a source of infinite strength). For over almost a Century, the University has been striving for and growing to newer heights of performance and outreach.

Empowerment of women, through education, has been the single-minded mission of this University ever since its establishment. Rules for B.P.T. Admission for the Academic year 2026-2027

Rules for admission to First Year of Physiotherapy Course prescribed by the SNTD Women's University for the academic year 2026 - 2027.

Duration of the course:

1. Annual Pattern: 4 years [38 weeks per year x 6 days per week x 6 hrs. per day minimum) academic training, excluding internal and University examination, extracurricular activities, Public Holidays and Vacations
2. Internship program: 01-year full time rotatory internship program. 4.5. Medium of instruction: English shall be the medium of instruction for all the subjects of study and for examination of the course.

Medium of instruction:

English shall be the medium of instruction for all the subjects of study and for examination of the course.

Eligibility for admission:

1. Selection Procedure:

- 1.1. Candidate must have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination by recognised any Indian board or a duly constituted Board or National Open School with pass marks with minimum 50% in aggregate of physics, chemistry and biology (botany & zoology).

However, in respect of the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, or Other Backward Classes (NCL), the minimum marks obtained in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology are taken together in the qualifying examination shall be 40% marks instead of 50% marks for Unreserved and General-EWS Candidates. In respect of PwBD/PwD candidates the minimum marks in the qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry, and Biology (or Botany & Zoology) taken together shall be 40% instead of 50%. **NEET UG will not be mandatory for admission year 2026-2027 to BPT.**

- 1.2. Admission to Bachelor of Physiotherapy course shall be made on the basis of eligibility (minimum 50% with physics, chemistry and biology for General Category and minimum 40% with physics, chemistry and biology for S.C./S.T./O.B.C./EWs.) and merit list based on 10+2 passing marks.
- 1.3. Candidates who have studied abroad and have passed the equivalent qualification as determined by the Association of Indian Universities and Equivalence Committee of the NCAHP, and must fulfil the criteria as per points 1-3 above.
- 1.4. Candidate should have attained the age of 17 years as on - current year, as on the date of admission.
- 1.5. Candidate has to furnish at the time of submission of application form, a certificate of Physical fitness from an Authorized Medical Attendant to ascertain that the candidate does not have any physical disability as per the guideline mentioned below
- 1.6. As per the Eligibility criteria described in Table 4.2, candidate can take admission on disability quota for BPT program.
 - i. Guidelines regarding admission of students with “Specified Disabilities” under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 with respect to admission in BPT Course
 - a. Note: The “Certificate of Disability” shall be issued in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)] on 15th June 2017.
 - b. The extent of “specified disability” in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the “Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)” notified in the Gazette of India by the Ministry

of Social Justice and Empowerment [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)] on 4th January 2018.

- c. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.
- d. The term 'Persons with Disabilities' (PwD) is to be used instead of the term 'Physically Handicapped' (PH).
- e. Quota/ reservation policy as per the State Government norms to be followed by the State Council as applicable during allotment of seats
- f. Candidate who fails to attend the Medical Examination on the notified date(s) will forfeit the claim for admission and placement in the waiting list except permitted by the competent authority under special circumstances.

Eligibility for Admission of State Student Seats and Management Seats

A candidate who desire admission on State Student Seats and Management Seats shall;-

1.1 be a Citizen of India:

Provided that the candidate whose parents are origin of India, and does not hold Indian citizenship and has applied for Indian citizenship, shall require to produce the proof of submission of such application to the Admission Committee before the date of counseling.

Such candidates shall be admitted provisionally subject to submission of the certificate of their having acquired the Indian citizenship on or before 31st July of next year, failing which their provisional admission shall be treated as cancelled without any notice.

2.1 The minimum requirement for State Student Seats and Management Seats must have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination by recognised any Indian board or a duly constituted Board or National Open School with pass marks with minimum 50% in aggregate of physics, chemistry and biology (botany & zoology) for General (open) category and minimum 40% in aggregate of physics, chemistry and biology (botany & zoology) for Reserved (SC / ST / SEBC/ EWS) Category for admission to the first Year B. Physiotherapy Course.

2.2. No candidate shall be admitted in the Bachelor of Physiotherapy courses unless she fulfills the eligibility criteria including the minimum qualifying percentage.

3.1. The merit order shall be determined on the basis of Bachelor of Physiotherapy course shall be merit list based on 10+2 passing marks. for State Student Seats and Management Seats.

3.2 (a) After application of rule 2.1 if still, the candidates have obtained equal marks, the total aggregate external marks in theory and practical in Science subjects and English (as above rule 1) should be considered determining merit order between candidates with equal aggregate external marks in theory in science subjects.


(b) If after application of rule 2.2(a) there are still candidates with equal marks, merit order should be determined on basis of percentage of marks obtained at S. S. C. examination.

4. The admission of candidates to a Physiotherapy Course shall be decided and granted on the basis of admission criteria by the University.

5. In case of any dispute about admission of candidates to Physiotherapy Course, the interpretation and the decision of the University / College Management shall be final.

6. If any of the statements made in the application form or any information/document supplied by the candidate in connection with her application or admission is later on at any time found to be false or incorrect or misleading, or if at any time that the candidate has mislead / cancelled any information/fact in connection with her application her admission shall be cancelled by the University/College Management without any notice thereof and fees shall be forfeited and she may be expelled and prosecuted.

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION THROUGH UNIVERSITY

7. A candidate for admission to First B. Physiotherapy course must submit to reach duly filled in application in the prescribed form to the respective College in prescribed time limit. The online application forms are also available at  Web.: ssptckadodara.org, candidates have to submit an online application on www.ssptckadodara.org and carefully fill-up all details and upload scan copy of required certificates / photograph.

8. The application for admission form duly filled for admission must be submitted by Registered Post or handed over personally, or submit an online on or before 05th August, 2026.

9. All the applicants who have submitted their application within the prescribed time limit in the form will be issued a receipt. The application form number of the application be used as a reference number in all future correspondence.
10. No application for admission will be considered unless it is accompanied by attested copies of the following certificates.
 - (1) H.S.C.E. (12th) Mark Sheet of all attempts at H.S.C. Examination.
 - (2) H.S.C. E. Attempt Certificate.
 - (3) School Leaving Certificate/Transference Certificate
 - (4) GUJCET / STATE CET / NEET examination Mark sheet.
 - (5) XI Standard Mark sheet.
 - (6) S.S.C.E. (10th) Mark sheet.
 - (7) S.S.C.E. Attempt Certificate.
 - (8) S.S.C.E. passing certificate issued by S.S.C.E. Board.
 - (9) Evidence showing date and place of birth where not shown in S.L.C./T.C.,
 - (10) Students who have migrated from other Universities/Boards and who are eligible for admission according to these rules, before admission to the Physiotherapy will have to produce a certificate of eligibility from the S.N.D.T. Women's University, Mumbai. to which the college is affiliated except those passing H.S.C. Examination of Gujarat, Goa, Daman,M.P., Assam and Maharashtra H.S.C.E. Board.
 - (11) Certificate of physical fitness to undergo the course in the prescribed form from a Registered Medical graduate of modern medicine having minimum qualification of M.B.B.S. (No separate certificate is required, as it is incorporated in the form of application.)
 - (12) Candidates seeking admission to the reserved Seats for SC/ST (including Garudi)/ SEBC/ EWS should submit, a certificate in the prescribed proforma as per G.R. at Social Welfare Deptt. clearly mentioning the Castes, Tribes, or Community to which she belongs from the respective authorities.
 - (13) Certificate of eligibility issued by the Gujarat Higher Secondary Board of Education for the candidate who have migrated to the Gujarat board during the Higher Secondary Education.
 - (14) Domicile / Passport copy if available for NRI Students.
11. The original certificates will have to be produced by the candidates for verification before the university admission authorities on submission and verification of original certificates either at the time of admission (Certificates produced late will not ordinarily be accepted) or at a later stage any discrepancy or incorrectness or alteration is noticed, the admission of such a candidate will be cancelled forthwith without any refund of fees and such a student may be expelled from the college by the University/Management and prosecuted if deemed necessary, without any notice thereof.
12. The authority mentioned above shall publish on the notice board the merit lists according to which admissions of the respective categories will be regulated. The selected candidates will also be informed individually by post instructing them to remain present on a specified date and to pay the fees. Those who fail to report on the specified date either in person or by a duly authorized representative and do not pay the full fees in prescribed time limit will be deemed to have forfeited the claim for admission. The Seats thus becoming available in consequence will be offered to the candidates on the waiting list in order of merit.
 - 12.1 (a) Even if a student pays the fees, but fails to join the B. Physiotherapy College, within 10 days from the commencement of the term or from the date of payment of full fees, whichever is later, the admitting authority concerned may at his discretion to cancel the admission of such student. The fees paid by such student will not be refunded under any circumstances.

- 12.1 (b) Even if a student pays up the fees and does not join the College but remains continuously absent for the period of 15 days without prior permission of the Director/Principal or Management of the B. Physiotherapy College at any time immediately/during the first term, her admission may be cancelled by the admitting authority/ Management at his discretion and the fees paid by students will also not be refunded.
- 12.1 (c) Any student who withdraws her claim / not responding for admission to Physiotherapy course which is offered to her according to her merit list, will not be considered for admission to the same.
13. The tuition fees and other legitimate charges for the First B. Physiotherapy Course shall be as prescribed by Government of Gujarat / University / Management from time to time.
14. Fees/Charges once paid will not be refunded under any circumstances. The whole amount of tuition fees actually paid will be refunded to the student who is admitted provisionally pending receipt of eligibility certificate, but who is later on declared ineligible for admission by the University.
15. If any information supplied by the candidate in connection with her admission is later on at any time is found to be incorrect, it will result in forfeit at all fees/charges paid by her and also dismissal of the student from the college, if so, decided by the University/College Management.
16. All the candidates applying for admission to the First Year B. Physiotherapy Course are required to give the following undertaking in prescribed form :
- 16.1 "I hereby declare that the above information furnished in the form is correct to the best of my knowledge and belief. I promise to abide by the rules of admission for the year which I have read in your prospectus and understood properly".
- 16.2 "I hereby agree if admitted, to confirm to the rules and regulations at present in force of that may hereafter be made for the governance of the college and I undertake that so long as I be a student of the course I will do nothing either inside or outside the college that will interfere with the orderly governance and discipline of the institution".

In case of any doubt, the interpretation and decision of the University / Management shall be final.

SEATS AVAILABLE FOR ADMISSION

For the purpose of admission to the first year Bachelor of Physiotherapy Courses, available seats shall include-

A. State Student Seats :

(1) All the sanctioned seats of the Bachelor of Physiotherapy Courses in the Institution excluding fifteen percent seats of Other than Gujarat State (O.S.) in the Bachelor of Physiotherapy course. (2) After deduction of the seats referred to in sub-rule (1) Seventy-five percent of the total sanctioned seats of the Bachelor of Physiotherapy Course in the Institutions are State Student Seats.

B. Management Seats :

After deduction of the seats referred to in sub-rule A.(1) Twenty-five percent seats of the total sanctioned seats of the Bachelor of Physiotherapy Course in the Institutions are Management Seats.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

The criteria for reservation of seats will be followed as per the norms of Government of Gujarat / University and Council as per amendments from time to time.

- 1 Fifteen percent (15%) of available seats for admission in Physiotherapy College shall be reserved for candidates of Other than Gujarat State Quota(O.S.) who are allotted for admission by the University for those candidates who had applied in Other than Gujarat State Quota(O.S.) .
- 2 After deduction of the seats referred to in sub-rule (1), the remaining available State Student seats shall be reserved for the candidate who are origin of Gujarat and falling under the following categories, namely:-
 - (a) Scheduled Castes(SC) : 7 %
 - (b) Scheduled Tribes(ST) : 15 %
 - (c) Socially and Educationally Backward Classes(SEBC) : 27 %
 - (d) Economically Weaker Section(EWS) : 10 %

Explanation : The reservation of the seats shall not be applicable for those who have migrated from other than Gujarat States.

- 3 A candidate seeking admission on reserved seat shall require to produce a Certificate of Caste from which she originates:
Provided that the candidate belonging to Socially and Educationally Backward Class shall be required to produce a certificate to the effect of non-inclusion in Creamy Layer in addition to the caste certificate.
A candidate seeking admission on Economically Weaker Section require to produce a Eligibility Certificate as per norms prescribed vide Gujarat Government Resolution No. EWS/122019/45903/A.
- 4 No caste certificate shall be valid unless it is duly signed, stamped, and issued by the authority empowered by the State Government.
- 5 No certificate to the effect of non-inclusion in Creamy Layer shall be valid, unless it is duly stamped, signed and issued by the authority empowered by the Government of Gujarat. Such certificate shall have been issued on or after the 1st April of the academic year in which the candidate is seeking admission.
- 6 If a candidate fails to submit the certificates as required under sub-rule (2) within the stipulated time, her candidature shall be considered for admission under unreserved category.
- 7 If a candidate of reserved category gets admission on unreserved seat in order of merits, she may be given admission on the unreserved seat according to her preference.
- 8 The admission of a candidate of a reserved category on a reserved seat shall be valid subject to the verification of caste certificate by the authority empowered by the University in this behalf. In case the caste certificate is found invalid on verification, she shall not have right to claim her admission on reserved seat and if she has been already granted admission, such admission shall be cancelled.
- 9 After granting admission to all the candidates of reserved categories on reserved seats, the reserved Category seats remaining vacant shall be transferred to the unreserved category seats.

RESERVATION FOR PHYSICALLY DISABLED

Five percent of the available seats in each category shall be reserved, for persons with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 as provided by respective council from time to time. (Enclosed Table: Eligibility criteria for 'Persons with Disabilities' (PwD) for admission to B.P.T.)

The admission on aforesaid reserved seats shall be subject to the furnishing of certificate duly issued by competent authority empowered by the University, in this behalf.

CASTE CERTIFICATES

As per the judgement of Hon. High Court of Gujarat dated 5/10/1996 in Special Civil Application Nos 5156.5453 & 5555 of 1996.

1. The Caste, Tribe or Backward Class Certificate for the reservation categories shall be considered only if it is issued and signed by one of the following authorities:
(a) The Collector, (b) The Prant Officer, (c) The Mamlatdar, (d) The Mahalkari, (e) The Director of Social Welfare / District Backward Class Welfare Officer Class, (f) The District Social Welfare officer, (g) District Development Officer / Deputy District Development officer class-I, (h) Taluka Development Officer and as per Government of Gujarat Circulars issued by the Social Welfare and Tribal Development Department from time to time for the said purpose. In case of any doubt or discrepancy about the caste, the decision of the Deputy Registrar, Special Cell of SNDT Women's University shall be treated as final.
2. Authorities competent to issue certificate in respect of castes/classes/groups recommended by the Socially and Economically Backward Class (excluding Creamy Layer) are as given below
(1) The Collector, (2) The Deputy Collector, (3) Revenue Officer not below the cadre of the mamlatdar (4) District Magistrate/Add. District Magistrate, (5) Sub Divisional Magistrate Executive Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate
3. The seats earmarked for open category will be filled in by common Merit list and the seats earmarked for admission of the particulars category students under reserved caste for the candidates from the category belonging to S.C/S.T. (including Garudi) SEBC (excluding Creamy Layers) etc. will be allotted for admissions of the students of the respective categories. For this purpose merit list will be prepared category wise and admissions for each category will be regulated accordingly.
As per Tribal Development Department G.R.No. MISO1098-CM-9CH Dated 15-3-99 the seats reserved for S.T.(including Garudi) Candidates shall be filled from amongst the candidates of S.T.(including Garudi) category only. However in the events of non availability of the requisite number of such S.T.(including Garudi) Candidate from this category consequential vacant seats shall be filled in by the available eligible candidates from merit list.
4. In case it is found in any particular year that the number of students belonging to respective communities and or categories mentioned above are not available for the reserved seats for such communities/ categories the vacant seats from that reservation shall be treated as unreserved and seats will be filled up from amongst the students from the open merit list for the purposes of these admission.
5. A candidate seeking admission on Economically Weaker Section require to produce a Eligibility Certificate as per norms prescribed vide Gujarat Government Resolution No. EWS/122019/45903/A.
6. The candidates seeking admission under reserved category will have to produce the caste Certificate from competent authority in prescribed proforma along with the application form.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

- The total seats for admission to 1st year Bachelor of Physiotherapy course will be 50 seats only.
- In the event of non availability of the requisite number on quota seats, the vacant seats shall be converted into regular seats and admission on the vacant seats of these quota will be filled from the merit list.
- The admission shall be on the bases of merit list prepared according to the S.N.D.T. Women's University for State Student Seats and Management Seats.
- NEET UG will not be mandatory for admission year 2026-2027 to BPT.

FEES

On being admission to the course, the student shall be required to pay full tuition fees as per the Rules/norms prescribed by the Govt. of Gujarat/S.N.D.T. Women's University from time to time and other legitimate charges decided by the University/College/Management.

All the fees are to be paid in cash or Demand Draft (D.D.) only at the accounts office of the College on any working day (Monday to Friday) between 11.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. The payment of full fees and charges by a student / parents is considered as confirmation of acceptance of admission. All fees are to be paid subject to revision.

Degree courses (B.P.T) Bachelor Physiotherapy

Physiotherapy is one of the healthcare professions. A Physiotherapist aims to promote, restore and maintain an individual's physical, psychological and social wellbeing. The key is patient focus, tailoring treatments to the needs of the individual. Not only do Physiotherapists treat physically, they are also involved with health promotion and illness prevention. As a science-based profession, practitioners aim to evaluate their practice continually and add to the current body of knowledge in order to provide the best possible care for patients.

Physiotherapists treat an incredibly diverse range of patients. Within a hospital setting they may work in burns and plastics, healthcare of the elderly, maternity, mental health, neurology, orthopaedics, outpatients, paediatrics, palliative care, primary care or respiratory, to name just the most common areas. Physiotherapists may choose to work in the private sector or in alternative settings such as the armed forces, charities, health education, industry, management or sport. This wide variety makes physiotherapy an exciting profession in which there are always new challenges and possibilities for career development.

Two themes run throughout both courses; one covers the basic principles of research culminating in a research project, and the other includes aspects relating to personal and professional development such as skills for effective management of learning, communication, models of healthcare or sport, health and wellbeing policy, medical and client records/ethics, personality, behaviour and lifelong learning.

The courses end with an additional 6 months placement for which you can apply to work in any speciality anywhere in the world, providing you are supervised by an appropriate practitioner whose qualifications are recognised by the relevant statutory body, or competent authority.

Why study Physiotherapy at SSPTC?

Teaching And learning methods: First and second year of the course are taught in the similar fashion. Each week new topics of theory and practicals are introduced using a variety of methods including lectures; tutorials supported by online resources .students are having their own laptops.

Lectures: A lectures lasts about 60 minutes, it depends on topic and subject. Where appropriate, makes use of audio-visual material ,key texts and guest speakers.

COLLEGE RULES FOR STUDENTS

- (1) A candidate is required to have minimum 80% of attendance in both theory and practical's especially in each subject before appearing to the examination.
- (2) Attendance in classes including attitude towards education & marks obtained at internal examinations will be taken into considerations in assessing academic progress of a student.
- (3) Absence from any college examination will not be excused unless written permission is given by the faculty concerned in consultation of head of the college Director / Principal in special circumstances.
- (4) Leave of absence from classes must be taken from faculty/ concerned teacher, Students returning late from leave are required to make up for the time missed in summer / winter vacations. In such case a medical certificate from a qualified and registered practitioner must be sent immediately and / or prior sanction of the head of the college must be obtained for more than one day leave.

Code of Conduct

The management would stress disciplined behavior of every student in the college campus.

- (1) Students are not allowed to paste notice within the institution without prior permission from the office of the Director / Principal and are forbidden to communicate with any outside authority directly. Any student infringe this rule will be suspended by the management.
- (2) Students must pay for all the damages caused by them to books and college properties or breakage of any apparatus.
- (3) Strictly forbidden in any part of institution are the
 - (a) possession or use of alcoholic beverages
 - (b) the possession of addictive or hallucigenic drugs
 - (c) gambling (d) wearing excessive of dangling Jewellery
 - (e) non-veg food.
- (4) The student should not leave the college and hostel and should not attend any function/party/any tour without prior permission in writing from the Management/Director / Principal.
- (5) Illness and minor ailments must be reported to college authority.
- (6) Ragging of any student is forbidden and punishable by fine, restriction or expulsion from college as per Government's norms.
- (7) Students must arrange for washable white overcoats which are to be worn at all time in the college and laboratories and on hospital duties and also procure their own dissecting instruments and instruments for Anatomy. Students are required to wear conventional sober dress, sports shoes. T-Shirts, high heel shoes, miniskirts, denims and shorts are strictly prohibited. **Nails must be short and neat.**
- (8) College/Hostel fees must be paid in full by the dates stated in the prospectus and on the bills.
- (9) All neglect of duties which is act of discipline are to be brought to the notice of the Director / Principal who can deal with any serious offence for which adverse entry in the personal file (G.R.) of the student may be made.
- (10) The decision of the University/management in all disputes would be final and binding to all the students.
- (11) After Completion of Eight Semester, one has to undergo 6 Months of Compulsory internship in Hospitals listed by the University and NO STIPEND IS PAID DURING INTERNSHIP.
